 - a. Confirmations – Updates from President Harmon “Welcome back everyone, training went very well last week. We had a great informative session in Canon city. We are excited to have everyone back in ASG.

Pack fest is on the 25th of August, I want to keep everyone informed that we had sign ups for the events. Thursday the 31st we have our first football game and it is going to be a 'Red Out' game and we will be representative of ASG when participating. we started with a \$70,000 dollar budget at the beginning of the year, we were projecting for a 10% cut, Chrissy Holiday suspected we would take a 12% cut but ended up going down just under 6%. With that being said we are going to approximate an \$3,800 cut from our budget which leaves us at \$66,200 to work with and to operate the budget before we pay everyone. I need to confirm with her that we are not taking that 10% projected cut. That's what we will be working with for the year. I talked with the Provost who is interested in creating a program academically to where we can support some of our students that are looking to go to grad school, for Medical school, for Law school. In doing so he would be very interested in providing courses for these students. He would be very interested in providing funds for that. From the Board of Gov during the 1st or 3rd of this month and are very excited to have our new president here and want to see a good vision for CSUP. President of school has a wonderful vision." President Harman is excited and supporting and hopes for student Gov to participate.
