 - a. Executive

i. President

- 1. Thank you everyone for being here. I want to start off with what I covered last week, the Board of Governors is coming February 8th. There is going to be a dinner and then some of the Student Organizations are going to be represented at that dinner; The BSU, the LSU, ASG and PLP. We are going to have three members, including myself, as ASG representatives there. The BSU already know they have three and LSU knows they have three. So, that's really exciting that we can display some of our finest members of the university to the Board of Governors just because it shows how diverse our school is, and the type of students that encompass our school.
- 2. I am interested tonight in some of the procedures that we can go through for emergency situations that we experienced last week with the A'viands delema. I still think we went through that as well as we could have but there was lapses in it that we could have been a little better and there is some room for improvement.
- 3. Right now you should have a budget in front for you or in front of the person sitting next to you, it's approximated at \$14,000, that is actually a conservative number, we are going to be looking at something more like 15,000 or 16,000 budget, Pro Temp Roberts mentioned that we are going to be working on some projects that have been traditional to ASG; through the business we are going to be doing the fiesta with the business, and we would like to put a Valentine's Day programme on as well and many other plans, so we need to start using those funds, and any additional ideas are welcome.
- 4. We have had a lot of applicants who are interested in ASG in the past three weeks and we are excited to bring the next people in.

ii. Vice President

- 1. Fall Break: I sent in all the feedback to APSB Board and they really appreciated what we had discussed. As soon as I get the minutes via email I will let you all know of any updates.
- 2. During Winter Break attended the Board of Alumni meeting and typically in the spring there is a President's Day Gala will be at our brand new Ballroom that is going through construction right now. Usually around that time there is an Alumni Event for ASG Presidents and Vice Presidents but this year we decided to make this reception for anyone who has ever previously been in ASG so we are hoping to get more attendance for this event. As for the actual President Gala I would advise speaking to Nick Potter Foundation to see about getting seats because those tickets do cost money but for now everyone is invited to the ASG Alumni Reception.

- i. Pro. Temp. Roberts:

The thought of going through the Policy Manual is a bit much to go through. My idea was that we create something that is 3-5 pages labeling past accomplishments, committees, the Senate makeup, each branches makeup. This way it will be a lot easier for people from the Today or from REV to come and see what we are about.

 - i. I have a couple questions regarding ASG and the OSU. How much money is operating budget for this semester of ASG amounting to?
 - 1. President Harmon: Around \$14,000 and that is after we have paid all of our Senators and Directors.
 - a. Who is giving you this budget?
 - i. President Harmon: Student Fee are, we are.
 - ii. How much total cost was the renovation of this building? (OSC)
 - 1. President Harmon: I believe it was just over 31 million dollars.
 - a. Where did the money for that come from? Strictly the Students? or Students Sponsors and other things?
 - i. President Harmon: It came specifically from the students from our course hours. Every course gets feed a certain dollar amount, so over the last 8 years maybe 6 years back of ASG they decided to create this fee and to create

this building/renovation. So this is our (students of CSU-Pueblo) building.

1. Vice President Trujillo: The Chieftain published the total cost of the OSC was 34 million and 30 million was funded by the students.
