B. ASG Updates

a. Executive

i. President Harmon:

- 1. Hurricane Harvey Update: Just over \$3,200 was the total raising of money. This project took off from the amazing support of the community. - 2. Lisa requested a schedule of when senators will be in the office.
- 3. How many senators have visited the visitors center? How many people are accessing the website? Conclusion, people go in person to office rather than accessing website.

i. Pro. Temp. Roberts:

- 2. Campus Sustainability had their first meeting of the year. Decided to break up into different task force. Recycling, energy efficiency and

composting will be doing all sorts of things for the university. Will report by the end of the month on what the university is currently doing.

iii. CEEPS Senators

1. Senator Becker:

- a. Working on Orchard Project with Senator Freed and Senator Boyd. Talked with Debbie Proctor about project getting grant for the Orchard Project's, finalized, location. Getting in the process of having an up to \$5,000 grant.
- b. Follow up on Pro Temp Roberts: Facilities being more sustainable by improving all old systems 12.5 million dollars project called FIMS (Facility Improvements Measurements System).
- c. Working on a turf management plan. Advocated half a million dollars to improve irrigation system.
- d. Disk Golf course facilities digging heels in the ground so that will be put off for another week.
- e. Maintenance day: Couple clubs from CEEPS shooting for the first week of October.
 - i. President Harmon: How many gallons of water could we save a year?
 1. Senator Becker: We could use about 40% less by watering in the mornings rather than during the middle of the day in the heat. Payback's 30 years.

1. Senator Jordan:

 - b. Orchard project: Realized there is a lot more that needs to get done. Don't have funds get the grant thought needed. Grant writing process to go through, due January 18th. Have to have spent the money and sent invoices for that money before April 2nd and send a report in by June 18th on what was done with the fund. It is a reimbursement grant, will be purchasing all things used towards the Orchard Project out of own pocket and they will reimburse them through the grant. Need to be creative with grant on how to fund the benches for the Orchard Project. Goal written by end of month to help get money so they know what money they have to purchase things and know exactly what they want to buy.
