- 1. Motion to commence meeting
 - a. Review and approval of April Minutes: (<u>https://www.csupueblo.edu/administrative-professional-council/minutes-newsletters.html</u>). Approved and seconded.
- 2. Old Business: Adam Pocius to present on the LINC (10-15 minutes) previously scheduled for the April meeting.

The LINC is the Learning, Innovating, and Networking Center. A lot of people involved in this initiative, and it's meant to help the lives of students and faculty members through innovation. Space is important and how do we use it? The pandemic changed where people go to learn, making the people working on the project realize the answer is everywhere. So they tasked themselves to figure out how to create spaces on our campus that are conducive to learning. Instead of "classrooms" we have "learning spaces." Instead of the traditional classroom set up, they are envisioning flexible spaces that can be rearranged for various activities, and they are meant to work in a hybrid way (online and in person). A "genius bar" for academics. The vision is to create a co-working space for faculty, students, staff, and community with peer (student) navigators in transformative teaching and co-learning spaces. There would be someone to help with digital needs (scheduled or drop-in), and it's a "playground" for experimentation. Coaching, tutoring, and project support. Integrated and holistic to keep people from being sent to various places. The library and IT are converging to create a different kind of space (although it goes beyond just the physical space). They are targeting the first, second, and third floors of the LARC. Once they had the vision (even before they received grant funding), they began pulling elements together to create these spaces, including the people (navigator teams of students located on the second floor). The IREPO grant has helped with purchases (furniture, technology, etc.).

CTL (Center for Teaching and Learning) will be on second floor sharing a classroom used for English and other classes, but the furniture is flexible and can be rearranged in different configurations. Also a Capstone space on the third floor (like a mini office with lockers). Continually developing (Adam described it as "building the ship while they're sailing it") and, thus far, has undergone a "soft" launch. Fall 2022, however, is a big launch. Before then, they are trying to get some construction done, but the service is already available. The space is accessible and available for everyone.

- v. HR Projects and Updates (HR Team)-Jennifer Quintana
 - 1. Juneteenth Holiday observing on 6/20. Time Off Corrections-if you requested leave for that day and your supervisor has already approved it, ask them to unapprove it so you can delete the leave.
 - 2. New Hire Dates (does not include adjunct faculty): Standardized—all APC and faculty have hire dates of the 1st and 16th of each month.
 - 3. APC Annual Compensation Analysis: subcommittee met on 6/7. Corey Schilling gathered data that the committee will review and randomize so that they can do spot checks for people who are under and over the compensation ranges. Will take about four weeks to complete that analysis. Once completed, they will send out letters that identify where people are within the compensation range for their job. This year, because of the Equal Pay Act, they are also looking at also looking at gender and minority equity as part of their analysis.
