3. Committee Updates

ULT Report

- Enrollment-
 - At ULT on Tuesday they talked about head count 3658 FTE the budget based on fall to spring loss. Overall enrollment is down 2.3-3% which is better than last year. Work was done to improve early alert to address Fall to Spring retention. Through these efforts we were able to retain 40-50 freshman which would not have been predicted to return based on GPA
 - Indications now look like we will be down 2.5 to 3% in the fall 80% increase in faculty using early alert Increasing contact with students about grades
 - Paul reported that we are reaching out to 30,000 current seniors and 64,000 sophomores and juniors through the partnership with Royal. We are also actively collecting parent information to better engage parents and connect with them.
 - They will be revamping Discover Days, two instead of one per semester.
 Enrollment Management wants to engage more faculty and staff in that process, data says that high school visits is not a useful and campus visits are better way to reach students.
 - Reported on the merit scholarship breakdown, we have now offered 600 merit scholarships over less than 150 last year. About 70 are currently accepted.
 Working with Deans on conversion. 1/3 are Hispanics
- ULT welcomed new VPFA, has long history in Colorado and well connected with legislature. He is working with system office in preparing the budget for next year and moving forward.

• Budget, we were about 5 million short and the system has discussed transferring 6 million for this year. The 3.3 cut was based on flat enrollment. And 6 percent tuition increase. If lower enrollment or less tuition increase, then there could be additional cuts
