\$1,000 Commitment to Colorado Award

Colorado residents who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 1 each year, receive a Pell Grant, and have at least a 3.0 GPA.

\$1,000 First Generation Scholarship

First generation college students (neither parent has received a bachelor's degree), 3.0 high school GPA, FAFSA complete by March 1.

Submit official transcripts

- Official high school transcripts or high school equivalency test scores.
- If taking college or university classes concurrently with high school courses, • submit official college transcripts after completing your last course.*

Submit official ACT or SAT test scores

- Official test scores are not required for first-time students graduating in 2021 or • any student who has earned college credit after graduating high school.
- The writing portion of the exam is not required. •

*Students who complete college courses while enrolled in high school are considered first-year freshmen, regardless of the number of credits earned.

NOTE: You will initially be notified of our admission decision on your application status page, usually 2-3 weeks after all required information is received.
