Appendix 2 is the evaluation form including the rubric of this SLO.	The case-based artifacts collected from MGMT 201 (Principles of Management) were used. Individual work from 33 students were assessed.	We expect that at least 70 percent of our students will meet or exceed our expectations.	There were two evaluation criteria: students 1) have ability to identify problem(s) in unstructured settings and 2) demonstrate ability to analyze appropriate information to develop viable recommendations. For 1st criterion, 91.3% of students exceeded or met expectation (exceeded or met expectation (exceeded a tont meet = 8.7%). For 2nd criterion, 91.2% of students exceeded or met expectations (exceeded = 30.9%, met = 60.3%, did not meet = 8.8%).	The result indicated that students could identify business problems and draw their conclusions and suggestions based on the analysis of appropriate information. More than 90% of students demonstrated 'Meets expectations' and 'Exceeds expectations', however, more emphasis on the analysis and the ability to develop viable recommendations might be a potential area for further improvement.
