Comments on part I: In 2013 the department's lone Anthropologist retired. We were able to hire a PhD anthropologist as a part-time adjunct instructor to continue to offer anthropology classes in AY 2013-2014. At that time, there were fewer than 5 anthropology minors and the number of minors declined to 2 in AY 2014-2015. In the fall of 2015 the department hired a PhD Social Anthropologist to fill a one year lecturer position. Although that individual had teaching commitments in the sociology program, with this new hire and the part-time adjunct hired previously, we were able to increase our anthropology course offerings and the department made a commitment to strengthen and continue our anthropology minor. We have continued this effort since then with program-level requirements and curriculum changes in the anthropology minor approved by the university Curriculum and Academic Program Board in each of the past 3 years. During this same time, with the two adjunct instructors doing the bulk of the work, we have revised the minor and quadrupled the number of declared minors to 16. In the past two years, 3 minors have completed internships with the State Archeologist's office, 4 have completed internships at El Pueblo Museum, 2 were awarded Smithsonian internships in summer 2018, and 1 completed an archaeological field project in summer 2017 for which he received a SURP stipend.

Due to the changes summarized above, the Anthropology Program has not completed annual assessments for the last several years. However, we feel we are now in a position to re-establish our program assessment procedures and will do so beginning in AY 2018-2019. A new assessment plan, already in draft form, will be finalized. An assessment test has already been developed along with a scoring rubric. It is currently the plan to administer the assessment test (developed by anthropology faculty) to each senior anthropology minor in the semester they plan to graduate. After the program revision was completed, a curriculum map was devised for the new program-level student learning outcomes.
