## General Education Board, Colorado State University-Pueblo 2010-2011 Administration of the Proficiency Profile, Summary of Results

This document presents key findings from the CSU-Pueblo administration of the ETS Proficiency Profile. The Proficiency Profile was adopted as part of the General Education Board's plan for assessing the general education student learning outcomes.

## Administration

The Proficiency Profile was administered to approximately 200 first-time first semester freshmen during the fall 2010 student orientation. Students were randomly selected from among all students participating in orientation and assigned to classrooms to participate in the test. Faculty and staff administered the timed, paper-and-pencil exam according to the ETS protocol.


Working with faculty who agreed to allow members of the General Education Board to administer the test in their upper-level classes, approximately 200 seniors from majors across campus completed the test during the Spring 2012 semester.

At the conclusion of the 2010-2011 academic year, the completed tests were returned to ETS for data analyses. In addition to the reports generated by ETS, Paul Chacon mathematics department professor, conducted additional analyses of the raw data to provide insight into student performance that was not available through ETS.

## Results


The following are results for our seniors compared to all master's comprehensive institutions (92):

- Total mean score for CSU-Pueblo was 445.48 (range 400-500); total mean for all institutions was 446.25
- Mean for critical thinking was 111.98 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 112.53
- Mean for reading was 119.26 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 118.72
- Mean for writing was 113.97 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 114.51
- Mean for mathematics was 114.12 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 113.64
- Mean for humanities was 115.40 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 115.44
- Mean for social sciences was 114.66 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 114.26
- Mean for natural sciences 115.57 (range 100-130); total mean for all institutions was 115.84




The following are results for our first-time first year students compared to all master's comprehensive institutions (56):

- Total mean score for CSU-Pueblo was 433.35; total mean for all institutions was 434.46
- Mean for critical thinking was 109.31; total mean for all institutions was 109.15
- Mean for reading was 114.24; total mean for all institutions was 114.78
- Mean for writing was 111.93; total mean for all institutions was 112.34
- Mean for mathematics was 111.25; total mean for all institutions was 111.06
- Mean for humanities 112.86; total mean for all institutions was 112.30
- Mean for social sciences 111.00; total mean for all institutions was 111.10
- Mean for natural sciences 112.38: total mean for all institutions was 112.83

- Total mean score for CSU-Pueblo freshman was 433.35; mean for seniors was 445.48
- Mean for critical thinking for freshman was 109.31; mean for seniors was 111.98
- Mean for reading for freshman was 114.24; mean for seniors was 119.26
- Mean for writing for freshman was 111.93; total mean for seniors was 113.97
- Mean for mathematics for freshman was 111.25; total mean for seniors was 114.12
- Mean for humanities for freshman was 112.86; total mean for seniors institutions was 115.40
- Mean for social sciences for freshman 111.00; total mean for seniors was 114.66
- Mean for natural sciences for freshman 112.38; total mean for seniors was 115.57
