1. Place a fraud alert on your credit and review your credit reports.

2. Close the accounts you know or believe may have been affected or fraudulently accessed.

3. File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission: 1.877.438.4338

4. File a report with your local law enforcement.

Campus Safety Walk

The Sheriff's Office Safe Walk Program provides a personal escort for students, faculty, and staff who are concerned about their safety. The program offers a walking escort from one location to another on the Colorado State University-Pueblo campus, seven days a week. The escort is provided by a Pueblo County Sheriff's Office Deputy on foot or in a Sheriff's Office vehicle. However, the escort also may be provided by a trained, radio-equipped student employee. To request an escort, call 719.583.6250 or 719.549.2373 when you need the escort (advanced reservations not accepted).

Operation Identification

Operation Identification involves the registering of valuable items with the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office at CSU-Pueblo. The Sheriff's Office will keep the record on file to be used for identification purposes should the items be stolen. Operation Identification forms can be accessed online at www.colostate-pueblo.edu/ CampusSafety, or stop by the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office at CSU-Pueblo in Administration Building 118 (downstairs from main entrance, ground level from east side of building).

Motorist Assist Program

The Motorist Assist Program is a 24-hour service that provides jump-starts, vehicle lockouts, and some flat tire services to people on campus.

Crime Prevention Presentations

Pueblo County Sheriff's Deputies are available to talk to any student or employee group on our campus. These talks educate members of the campus communities about security and safety issues and various techniques that can be used to prevent crime on campus.

Sexual Assault Awareness, Education and Prevention

It is estimated that the percentage of completed or attempted rape victimization among women in higher educational institutions may be between 20% and 25% over the course of a college career. The program provides information and resources specific to sexual abuse, including available campus and local sexual abuse resources.

Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program

The Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program increases awareness, promotes responsible behavior, and helps develop a culture of mutual responsibility in the CSU-Pueblo campus community. CSU-Pueblo and The Pueblo County Sheriff's Office do not advocate underage drinking, and we encourage CSU-Pueblo students to help friends make safe party choices.

Annual Security and Fire Saftey Report

The CSU-Pueblo Campus Security and Fire Safety Report contains fire and crime statistics for three years, including reported crimes that occurred on campus, in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by CSU-Pueblo, or on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning fire safety and campus security, such as sexual assault.
