- Are taught by qualified on-campus and adjunct faculty.
- Require students to purchase books and course materials separately.

Maximum flexibility

Sign up virtually any time* with 6 months to complete the course.

Work at your own pace

Complete the work at your own pace during your six month time frame. Extensions for an additional six months are available for an additional fee.

Print or web-based options

Traditional correspondence course format allows you to access courses though Blackboard or request a printed syllabus mailed to you.

Flexible communication options

Communicate with your instructor by email or US postal mail.

Self or third party pay options are available for Extended Learning courses.
