#### **Electives (34 Semester Hours)**

Students will take 34 credut hours of electives, in which 12 credit hours must be 300-400 level in any prefix.

### **Institutional Graduation Requirements:**

- o Total of 120 semester hours, minimum.
- o Complete a minimum of 40 semester hours in upper-division courses (300-499).
- o Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00.
- A minimum of 60 semester hours must be earned from a four-year institution. Of these, a minimum of 30 semester hours of credit
  must be earned in residence.
- Of the last 30 semester credits earned preceding graduation, no more than 15 may be completed at other colleges or universities.

## **Additional Major Graduation Requirements:**

- No grade below C is acceptable in the major.
- O Degree option is only available to students with 30 credits or more.
- The requirements for general education cannot be counted twice, fulfilling the general education and interdisciplinary core requirements. A student cannot count credits for the Interdisciplinary Studies degree towards a second degree/major/minor.
