Graphing Calculators: A graphing calculator will be required for this course. I strongly recommend using the TI-84/84+ calculator. You need to bring this every day to class.

Course Description: Polynomial, rational, exponential and logarithmic functions; solution of systems of equations; trigonometric, circular and certain special functions. Prerequisites: Satisfactory placement exam score. Two years of high school algebra or equivalent. (F,S)

Evaluation/Grading Procedures:

Grade Basis: points will be accumulated from homework, quizzes and tests. - Using unauthorized materials not approved by the teacher during a quiz, test, or exam.
- Stealing, reproducing, circulating, or otherwise gaining access to quiz, test, or exam materials prior to the time authorized by the teacher.
- Retaining, possessing, using, or circulating previously given quiz, test, or exam materials without approval from the teacher.

In <u>any</u> case of cheating or academic dishonesty, the following consequences will occur:

- 1. Student will receive an automatic "0" for the assignment/assessment in question and no makeup will be granted
- 2. Teacher will notify the student's parents/legal guardians
- 3. A disciplinary referral will be written.
