Extended Studies is excited to announce that students can now start and finish the B.A. and B.S. in Psychology degrees entirely through the Independent Study program. Students can earn their bachelor's degree in psychology by taking self-paced courses digitally through Blackboard or through the print-based correspondence modality. Psychology is the 5th degree option offered through the Independent Study program and was one of the most requested degree programs by current and prospective justice-involved students. Extended Studies is proud to offer this degree option for distance learners, including those in correctional facilities in Colorado and nationwide.

Division of Extended Studies- Expanding Educational Access

The primary goal of the Division of Extended Studies is to provide courses to part-time students. A variety of educational methods – classroom instruction, correspondence, on-line courses, conferences, workshops and seminars – are utilized to expand educational access and meet the needs of students at convenient times and settings. Students may earn academic credit toward a degree, study for career advancement, or pursue cultural and vocational interests.

STUDENT RESOURCES

PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT (PLA)

CSU Pueblo Extended Studies degree programs have been approved on the Colorado Workforce Board's Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL)*. Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), prospective students who wish to start a CSU Pueblo Division of Extended Studies degree program can apply for funding from their local Workforce Board. Funds can be applied toward tuition, supplies, books, or equipment related to pursuing a degree. For more information, contact your local Workforce Development Board to see if you qualify for funds to help you pursue your degree and enhance your skills with CSU Pueblo!

*Funding eligibility is determined at the local level. A few local areas do not support certain degree programs.
