TEP Increases National Presence and Sees Growth

Over the past two months, TEP has onboarded four new providers and is in the final steps of developing partnerships with school districts. To date, TEP partners with 48 providers in 17 states and serves students across the United States and 11 countries worldwide. Additionally, the number of providers who serve 500+ students has doubled in less than two years resulting in in an enrollment increase in our Masters

Ultimately, the growth of TEP strengthens the connection of highly qualified teachers with global education systems.

Recently, the TEP Team met with all providers who submitted student work samples. We worked to create individualized goals shared between TEP and each provider. In addition, over 500 courses are undergoing syllabus renewal in 2025 in accordance with HLC accreditation guidelines.

TEP staff has begun to work closely with impacted providers to further enhance those partnerships.

TEP staff will attend the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) at Work® conference in February where they plan to learn about sustained, substantive school improvement strategies. At the conference, the team will spread the word about TEP at CSU Pueblo, make connections with a national education network, and participate in strategies that impact our educator students.
