

# Who Is Providing Healthcare Coverage in 2014\*?

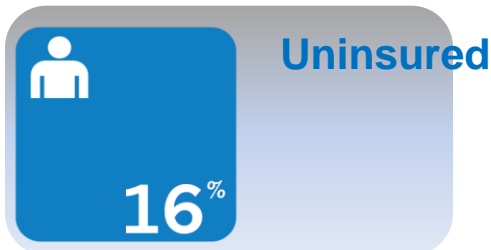


## CSU-Pueblo's plan:

- Available to exempt faculty or administrative employees regularly scheduled to work at least .5 FTE and are included on the payroll records of the Employer
- Comprehensive coverage that accounts for approximately 89% of total healthcare expenses (required legal minimum is 60%)
- 68% contribution toward the employee-only plan
- 68% contribution toward the family plan

Medicaid expansion is projected to decrease the number of those who are uninsured.



Some individuals may qualify for government subsidies toward the cost of coverage through the new State/Federal health insurance marketplaces (exchanges). To qualify, you must have no access to an employer-sponsored or other health insurance plan, or the plan offered must be below minimum required standards of value and affordability. For those that qualify, the amount of subsidy depends on their family size and household income.

*\*This snapshot does not include individuals on Medicare (age 65 or older) who will make up approximately 16% of the total U.S. population in 2014-2015. In addition, some other government programs will also satisfy the coverage requirements, such as Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), TRICARE, and certain veterans' health coverage.*
