This checklist is a tool to assist CSU-Pueblo instructors in determining whether you may make or distribute copies of copyrighted works without obtaining the permission of the copyright holder. The Library recommends you complete and retain a copy of this form in connection with each "fair use" application.

## The Four Factors of Fair Use

Purpose

Fair use permits the unlicensed use of copyright-protected works in certain circumstances. Copyright law names four factors that must be considered in deciding whether an unlicensed use is acceptable.
