



Yixin Wan is Associate Professor at the Nanchang University (NCU) School of Music in China, where he conducts the NCU Wind Orchestra and the NCU Symphony Orchestra and teaches instrumental conducting. He has also held the positions of conductor of the Jiangxi Wind Orchestra and the Nanchang Philharmonic.

Wan studied trumpet and **conducting for eight years at Central Conservatory of Music** (Beijing), Beijing Normal University, and Tianjin Conservatory of Music where he holds an undergraduate degree and a master's degree. His teachers include Professor Hai Yu, Zhonghui Dai, and Rui Chen. In 2012, he was sponsored by NCU to study conducting with Dr. Scott Weiss at the University of South Carolina (USC) where he was a graduate assistant conductor of the USC Wind Ensemble.

Yixin Wan has performed with many wind bands and orchestras, including the USC Wind Ensemble, the Central Conservatory of Music Symphonic Band, the China National Opera House, the Shenzhen symphony Orchestra, the Wroclaw Symphony Orchestra in Poland. He recently won the 1st prize in the 2019 Lipinsky International Conducting Competition (Professional Division). Wan's NCU Wind Orchestra won the 1st prize in the China National Band Competition in 2011, and his NCU Symphony Orchestra won the 1st prize in the 5th China National College Orchestra Competition in 2018.
