From the President

Campus Community,

Welcome to the fall 2019 semester. I hope you had some unstructured time this summer that allowed you to reconnect with family and friends and invest some time in taking care of yourself.

We are a "university on a mission." I'm very proud of the work we have completed, and I am excited about the work that's in front of us.

This past year, we worked through some very tough challenges. We managed a critical accounting error dating back almost two decades that included changes to personnel and reporting structures; we managed a \$2.7 million FY20 budget reduction through incentivized retirements, natural attrition, and a targeted and limited reduction in staff. But, together we successfully...

- Graduated over 836 graduates in an on-campus, all-employee hosted commencement ceremony.
- Developed a new vision based on the bold idea of becoming the people's university of the southwest United States.
- Broke ground on a state funded \$16.8 million renovation project that will transform the Psychology Building into the new Center for Integrated Human Health and Humanities.
- Increased "new student enrollment" (1,061 new freshmen and transfers) by more than 4 percent and increased student retention from 63% to 68% over prior year.
- Were invited to serve as a Reisher Scholarship campus that will provide our students with an additional \$200,000 in scholarships for FY20.
- Received a \$3.75 million Hispanic Serving Institution Programs 5-year cooperative grant award through the Department of Education to fund transfer advising and teacher education initiatives.

This semester, we will begin to fully implement Vision 2028 in order to create a differentiated student experience, target new student populations, and reimagine the way we do our work. Today, our mission is to serve our students. We must meet their needs in and out of the classroom and remove the barriers that keep them from persisting and earning their degrees.

Convocation week offers us an opportunity to professionally recharge, connect with our colleagues, and plan the year ahead. I encourage you to take advantage of this time together. Share your ideas, your voices, your expertise, and your hope for our future.

Thank you for all that you do to support our students and each other. Let's have a good year.

Academic Excellence at CSU-Pueblo

Dear Colleagues,

It is my pleasure to welcome you to a new academic year and thank you for a wonderful first year. I am hopeful that you have had a restful and rejuvenating summer and are ready for another year of dedicated teaching, advising, service, and research. As we all know, Higher Education is not the same environment it was a few years ago. It has become a dynamic environment where for us to remain relevant, we have to be willing to examine where we are and adapt quickly to the needs of the market place. In doing so, we will need to work together on many fronts, including the following:

- 1. Identify best practices and policies and provide opportunities for professional development for faculty and staff to create a work environment that is conducive to employee satisfaction and student success.
- 2. Thoroughly review curricula and delivery mechanisms (Online, Hybrid, Traditional ...) including general education and capstone experiences to identify needs, reinvigorate our programs, and align them to market needs and student demand.
- 3. Be innovative and identify opportunities for growth, including cutting edge programs that cater to the market targeting professional graduate programs and completion degrees that serve nontraditional populations.
- 4. Obtain external resources and grant funding to support scholarship, creative activities, and opportunities for engaging students in high impact practices.
- 5. Focus on engaging students through balanced advising and mentoring; providing guidance and support, while empowering students throughout their educational journey.

The previous academic year saw progress on many of these priorities. One priority for CSU-Pueblo is the creation of a **satisfactory and rewarding work environment** that is conducive to academic excellence and student success, while **financially sustainable**. I was glad we were able to allocate funds towards **faculty equity** in 2018/2019 with a promise to continue these efforts in the future. The provost office will continue to promote equity, support professional development, increase internal funding for scholarship and creative activities while balancing the diverse interests of faculty from all disciplines. These will be facilitated through the increased efficiencies in delivering academic programs and other services as well as entrepreneurial activities of the faculty and departments and seeking external funding.

Last year, we started work on the renovation of the Psychology building aiming for a model for **Integrated Human Health and Humanities**. This integration model represents an approach to interdisciplinary collaboration at CSU-Pueblo. It is also in line with our **Vision 2028** and the guiding principles that will shape our future through the next decade. With the expanded academic needs for Vision 2028 and the requirements for HLC accreditation, the Provost office had to increase its capacity to support academic units and faculty. Hence, the following low cost, high impact changes, will be in effect this academic year:

- 1. Duties related to accreditation and implementation of Vision 2028 will be covered as follows:
 - Dr. Caprioglio will support accreditation and assessment as Executive Director for Assessment and Institutional Effectiveness (0.75 FTE).
 - Dr. Vandenheuvel will serve as Executive Director for Undergraduate Studies (0.75 FTE). This position will support Vision 2028 academic initiatives focused on student success.

- 2. Dr. Susan Belport will serve as Director for Graduate Studies (0.5 FTE). She will work with the Graduate Studies Board to enhance our graduate programs.
- 3. The Office of Research and Sponsored Programs (reinstituted with support from the Indirect Cost recovery from grants) is led by Dr. John Williamson (0.75 FTE) and Ms. Nicole Quartiero (0.25 FTE). It will facilitate grant identification, submission, and compliance.
- 4. The Center for Honors and Leadership, under the leadership of Dr. Volk and Ms. Shelly Moreschini, will administer both the Honors and the President Leadership programs allowing for synergies, collaboration, and effective use of resources.

Last year also saw many successes on the front of the academic programming. We gained approval for and started our first Doctoral program with the **Doctorate of Nursing Practice (DNP)**. This new degree reflected the determination of our graduate nursing faculty and their efforts led by Drs. Kalevela, Franta, and Belport. Dr. Foust led efforts to create a **BS degree in Health Sciences** aimed at increasing retention and providing alternative career options to students interested in the Health fields. The newly restructured **School of Nursing and Health Sciences** will house this new degree. Dr. Folkestad and Prof. Steffen worked diligently with CHASS faculty to develop a new completion degree as a **BA in Humanities and Social Sciences** that will help many students reach the final destination of a college degree. Dr. Reilly Sandoval and the faculty of the Social Work program are having an excellent start for the new **Master of Social Work** (MSW) program in fall 2019. The Division of Extended Studies, led by Dr. White-Davis and collaborating with a multidisciplinary group of faculty developed a **new online degree**, designed for adult learners.

Moreover, we expanded our **online offerings** with new online courses and programs. The Teacher Education Program (TEP) will be offering the **Master of Education program online** in the fall 2019 semester, which came to fruition through the efforts of Dr. Piquette and the TEP faculty working with Extended Studies. These online offerings reflected the entrepreneurship of many faculty and staff and a spirit of collaboration within academic affairs. Incentives from such innovations are available to the academic units and will **support various faculty development**, **scholarly and creative activities**. We have also started initiatives focused on student success, including those targeting **remedial education in English and Mathematics** through the efforts of the English and Mathematics faculty and the leadership of Drs. Eskew, Chacon, Folkestad, and Lehmpuhl. These changes and newly developed and implemented programs were facilitated by the hard work of members of the Curriculum and Academic Programs board led by Professor Nichols.

On the crucial accreditation front, we received favorable accreditation decisions on programs in **Business** and **Nursing** thanks to the efforts of the faculty and leadership of Drs. Raymond, Shah, Kalevela, and Franta. We submitted an interim report to the HLC and commenced preparing for our next HLC accreditation visit in 2020. The HLC work led by Drs. Caprioglio and Calhoun-Stuber required collaboration from all faculty and staff across campus and the support of the **faculty senate** under Dr. Massey's leadership.

As we start the new academic year, I want us to be aware of the work that lies ahead, proud of what we have accomplished over a short period and excited about what we will achieve in the future for our students at CSU-Pueblo. Thank you for all your dedication and hard work. I look forward to working with all of you over the coming year.
