FERPA - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act - WHAT ARE THE BASIC RULES?

- Student education records are considered confidential and <u>cannot</u> be released without written consent of the student.
- As a faculty or staff member you have a responsibility to protect education records in your possession.
- Some information is considered Directory Information. Directory Information <u>may</u> be released without the student's written permission. However, a number of students choose to keep this information confidential.
- A student who chooses to keep Directory Information confidential is designated in AIS
 with a red "DO NOT RELEASE". This notation means we cannot even acknowledge that
 this individual is a student at CSU-Pueblo.
- You have access to information only for legitimate use in completion of your responsibilities as a CSU-Pueblo employee. "Need to know" is the basic principle.
- If you are ever in doubt, do not release any information until you talk to a Registrar's Office staff member (x2261).

Below is a list of what CSU-Pueblo considers Directory Information:

- Student name
- Address
- Electronic Mail Address
- Telephone listing
- Photograph
- Date and place of birth
- Major field of study
- Grade level
- Enrollment status (i.e. undergraduate/graduate, full-time/part-time)
- Dates of attendance
- Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Degrees, honors, and awards received
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended
