Guidelines for Admission to Student Teaching:

Guidelines for Program Completion/Student Teaching:

- 1. Completion of ED 412/512 or EXHP 465/565 with a grade of "C" or better is required for program completion.
- 2. Direct observation for this standard may not always be possible; interviews with other educators will provide additional information (e.g., cooperating teacher, building principal).
- 4.
