Fraternity & Sorority membership assists the transition process by offering scholarship programs that include study partners, study hours and time management workshops.

Fraternities and sororities are organizations of men and women who come together to form a personal network of individuals with similar ideas, interests, and a mutual pursuit of a well-rounded college education. These organizations are rooted in four founding values that foster leadership skills, siblinghood, a sense of civic responsibility, and higher academic achievement.

Be supportive and learn as much as you can by asking your student questions prior to and throughout their membership. It is important that you understand the financial commitment your student is making. Be an advocate for your student and encourage them to take advantage of all the opportunities their membership in the fraternity or sorority provides. Your awareness and education on their participation allows you to understand their experience, providing benefits to you and your student.

Fraternity and sorority members are educated on the dangers of hazing and how to report incidents to both university staff and police officers.

Fraternity and sorority membership is a lifelong commitment. Once you are an initiated member, you remain a member for life. Fraternity and sorority membership provides an immediate connection with thousands of other members. There are many successful fraternity and sorority alumni all over the country who are always looking to hire the best and the brightest that the fraternity and sorority community has to offer.

Whether or not a student is a member of a fraternity or sorority does not necessarily indicate that they will be more or less likely to partake in that culture. CSU-Pueblo fraternity & sorority members are educated on the dangers of alcohol each semester.
