## ABOUT STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

**TRIO** - Student Support Services purpose is to increase the retention and graduation rates of low income, first generation students and students with disabilities at Colorado State University-Pueblo .This is accomplished by providing supportive services such as: academic action planning, tutoring, and monitoring of student academic progress. Participants are eligible to utilize academic success seminars, mentoring, college success course, academic, financial and graduate school advisement.

**To be eligible to receive services from TRIO - Student Support Services Project you must:**

- Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment at CSU-Pueblo as an undergraduate student.
- Be a citizen, national or permanent resident of the United States.
- Be a low-income student as outlined by the Department of Education criteria; or,
- Be a first generation student; or,
- Be a student with a documented disability.
- Meet the academic need criteria as established by the CSU-Pueblo SSS Project.



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
