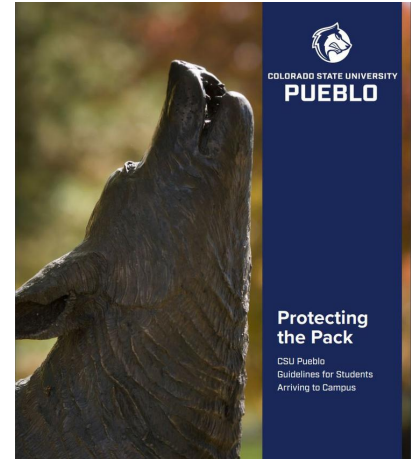

ARRIVAL GUIDE PROMOTES PACK WELLNESS

Earlier this summer, the Student Affairs team began developing a student resource to guide students' arrival to campus in these unusual times. In coordination with the COVID response team and other key departments around campus, they developed the [Pack Arrival Guide](#), which serves as a one-stop resource for the most urgent information and common questions we have received from students this summer. The guide was shared with students and their families earlier this week, as part of a joint EMCSA and Academic Affairs communication. It includes important information about topics such as move-in and housing, student activities, support services, safety, and the end of the semester. It also contains the Protect the Pack Pledge, which outlines how our campus community will support wellness – washing our hands regularly, wearing a mask, avoiding large gatherings, monitoring ourselves for signs of illness, and reporting any potential exposures to COVID-19. It also serves as an excellent resource for campus personnel. Student education is essential to a safe fall semester, as we help our students recognize the role they play in the continued health and safety of our campus community.



BANNER INTEGRATION GAINS MOMENTUM

CSU Pueblo is converting its AIS student information system to Banner, and the new environment has started go-live activities for Fall 2021 rollout. Banner will improve student service capabilities, and is supporting alignment within the CSU System. As a result of system investment in this joint technology, teams in Pueblo and Ft Collins are streamlining processes to create efficiency and a system experience for students who attend both campuses. About 300,000 general person records were successfully migrated from AIS to Banner in July, including all prior and current employee and student demographic information. Next steps include populating Fall 2021 applicant information from the new admissions CRM, Slate, into Banner. Migration of additional data to Banner will occur in September, including general student (e.g., high school, college, score, and semester data), financial aid, and catalog data. Many Admissions and Registrar staff already have the system access and training needed to process applicants, and user groups will expand as more modules go live. Campus stakeholders are identifying reporting needs and necessary integrations with third party software. Much foundational work has been completed, though a long road remains. This fall, the Banner financial aid module will go live in order to begin awarding aid for 2021, as will the ability to build Fall 2021 course sections. A substantial number of people across campus are involved in the data migration, configuration, testing, and training that is necessary to prepare campus for the new environment.



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
