So Colorado Spring and Pueblo students are reported separately. The formula used is (Measure1 + Measure 2)/2= total meeting proficiency. We are required by CSWE to use this formula. Pueblo = 82%; Colorado Springs = 81%. Total = 82%	Faculty were surprised at the variation in competency scores (in some cases low scores) and differences between Pueblo and Colorado Springs students. Faculty agreed the assessment tool was not capturing in all areas what we believe students know. After considerable discussion, what was realized is that each faculty member developed a series of questions on specific competencies and was put together in one document using "many voices." As a result, one faculty member was tasked with creating a new assessment coming from "one voice" while considering all faculty members input.	Faculty consistently agreed that although the competencies are in every syllabus and we refer to them at the beginning of the semester, the students are not paying attention to them. Therefore, we decided to make a concerted effort in our class to: 1) discuss the competencies and their importance, 2) to refer back to the competencies throughout the semester--application of the competency to specific assignments, discussions, videos etc. taking place in class. The goal is for students to connect what they are doing in the Social Work Program to the professional competencies of Social Work. Having constant repetition of competencies (and their understanding) will become second nature to students!

We recognized immediately that we needed to focus more on diversity, intervention, and evaluation of practice.	2020-2021 AY	Faculty agreed that we needed to reevaluate our assessment tool as it appears we were testing on facts about a subject rather than general knowledge about the competencies.	In Spring 2022, Dr. Pam Richmond revamped our assessment questions and faculty reviewed these questions in March 2022. After approval of questions, the department field tested the assessment with MSW students to ensure the questions were clear.	We have incorporated student suggestions from the field test and will run this new assessment tool in April 2022 and July 2022.
We recognized that field instructors and students needed more training on recognizing activities that fall into each competency, particularly numbers 2, 8, and 9.	2020-2021 AY	Field Coordinator and Field Liaisons were to engage with field supervisors and students to provide examples and review the learning plan to ensure activities were listed under the appropriate competencies.	Field Coordinator and Field Liaisons engaged with field supervisors and students to ensure activities were recorded appropriately on the AY 2021-2022 field evaluations and that all competencies were scored.	We believe our assessment data will show increased scores in the competencies for the AY 2021-2022 due to this renewed emphasis on documenting activities for each competency on the learning plan and evaluation.
