        - 1. Aaron Brooks and Deshawn King sworn in as Senators.
- d. Discuss Possibilities for Fall Break
  - i. Vice President Trujillo: I sat on a committee called the the APSB Board at CSU for the Academic Policies and Standards Board. A lot of stuff goes through regarding different academic policies and things that are going on.

I was asked to bring this information to my constituents, which is you guys. President Mottet is wanting to start having a Fall Break starting as soon as possible. I am not sure if it will be possible by the Fall of 2018 or the following year. There is a couple different options for this, so wanted to give you guys what the ideas are so that you guess can form a disunion as to why, and if you think of any other ideas while we are discussing this, I want to spend maybe no more than ten minutes of this discussion. The idea that President Mottet proposed is that we would start school on a Thursday, have classes for those two days, and in October take two days off for class. Another alternative they are thinking of is taking two days away from Thanksgiving break and putting those extra two days in October. Those were the ideas they were thinking of but they wanted a students point of view on this topic so that we can try to come up with a better way to actually have a Fall Break. Part of the issue is that CSU-Pueblo has to meet a certain amount of hours of actual class time in with their professor so CSU-Pueblo was meeting the bare minimum. At this point we can not just take off two days without having to make up those two days for later. I wanted to see what you all would would think from a students perspective.

- 1. President Harmon: Just to clarify, you mentioned we would start on a Thursday, do you mean start break on the Thursday?
- 2. Vice President Trujillo: The Thursday before classes usually start for Fall, thats the day of Faculty complication. Instead of them having that we would instead have classes that day. Thursday and Friday would be Syllabus days.
- 3. Senator Marrow: (motion to open floor)
- 4. Motion made by Senator Marrow, Seconded by Senator Jordan
- 5. Pro. Temp Roberts: What you are saying is the we would start the fall school year of 2018 on August 16th to start two days earlier and then have two days off in October?
- 6. Vice President Trujillo: They would be consecutive, so like a full day weekend.
- 7. Director Ettleman: Would this include faculty members? or would they still have to come in?
- 8. Vice President Trujillo: They would make those days optional for students to come in but they would make Faculty insist they have some sort of activity for students to do. They wouldn't be allowed to introduce more material or anything that you can get a grade on. They cannot include extra credit and they can't assign anything on those days. So it would be optional for those days for students to come in. If they need the help they can come in and if they don't then its up to them. It's not mandatory days but it will be for faculty.
- 9. Director Ettleman: Is there anyway faculty can be part of that, is President. Mottet willing to talk about that?

- 10. Vice President Trujillo: If you would like for that to be up for discussion then I can definitely bring that back to the board.
- 11. Director Ettleman: I was at the Gen Ed Meet and Greet I was talking with them and they said the burn out around that time is the same for the teachers. Is there a way that we can take the two days or even a week from winter break?
- 12. Vice President Trujillo: My concern is that is we have two days just for syllabus and two days added on to break, what in the attendance going to look like with everything being so lenient? If we put those two days towards winter break would we be able to just put finals on those two days?
- 13. Pro Temp Roberts: What about the students who are flying in from winter break on the late Sunday nights, if we have classes on those two days how can we expect students to make it to class when its now on a Thursday/ Friday.
- 14. Chief Justice Rogers: I would almost say take an entire week off for that Fall Break and take it off of Winter Break because Winter Break is five weeks, can we deal with four weeks? I feel like that is a substantial amount of time for students. The problem with the two days of break is that there are out of state students and they barely have the funds to go back home for Thanksgiving Break, let alone two days. The thing is, if you are living on campus and there is "no school", that means the campus is technically closed, then Housing has to charge for students to stay on campus and that's going to be \$200 alone. They shouldn't need to spend that money.
- 15. Director Ettleman: What is Fall Break like on other campuses? is their Thanksgiving Break only three days?
- 16. Vice President Trujillo: I can get the actual data for you on that. From what I am familiar with is that other Universities have a full week of Thanksgiving Break. They do have a Fall Break but that is because they have a longer semester. They are also able to take three day weekend for Labor Day, Veterans Day..

## B. ASG Updates

#### a. Executive

#### i. President Harmon

1. Would like to formally invite everyone into this space. We are so excited to be in this building and glad that we raised the funds of \$30,000,000+ were raised by the students facility, so I am very excited to be back in here. I just want to briefly go over, I think we can really run our wheels to a point where we just are completely exhausted by the end of the semester. So I want to briefly go over what we have accomplished last semester if you'll allow me to. The Facility Fee Budget has released over

\$140,000 worth of money for projects this year, just from that pot alone. In doing to we have replaced the pool filter, distributed the newest wolf statues along campus, relocated current benches (concrete benches from the Belmont area to the Art roof), we painted the water tower, we have taken on a large landscaping project of approximately \$20,000 in various locations throughout the campus, we have gathered more popularity on social media than in any previous ASG, we also adversed, collected, constructed and delivered a \$3,200 dollar service project to the Houston area after Hurricane Harvey. This year The Associated Student's Government has been recognized by the Chieftain for a community service award, also ASG this year has been recognized by the Red Cross with a Community Service Award. Sometimes it can feel like we are just spinning our wheels and a lot of that I think is related to our academics, you know, we are going so strong in our coursework that sometimes we may push it to the side but as we move forward I would encourage you to remain the duration of the semester with zeal and passion towards serving the students because I will be right along side you, I am excited to close out this year strong.

### ii. Vice President Trujillo

- 1. Thank your everybody taking our office by storm for those who have helped us unpack over break. I am really excited for everybody to start doing their office hours and for everybody to be together in our new spaces.
